

Devotional for Each Day of the Week

Sunday: “I will sing to the Lord, for He has triumphed gloriously! The horse and its rider He has thrown into the sea!”—Exodus 15:1b. **Praise God, and pray that our nation would see Jesus’ triumph. Pray** for First Reformed Presbyterian Church, Grand Rapids, Michigan, pastored by Craig Scott; pray especially for its street preaching ministry.

Monday: “The Lord is my strength and song, and He has become my salvation.”—Exodus 15:2a. **Pray** that God would give you the grace of salvation and assurance. **Pray** that Chris Myers’ seven job interviews would go well, and that he would be offered a job here in Atlanta.
