

Devotional for Each Day of the Week

Sunday: “Great is the Lord, and greatly to be praised in the city of our God, in His holy mountain.”—Psalm 48:1. **Pray** that the Lord would be worshipped in this and every church according to His commands. **Pray** for Rev. and Mrs. George Gregory, whose two-year old son just died.

Monday: “If then you were raised with Christ, seek those things which are above, where Christ is sitting at the right hand of God.”—Colossians 3:1. **Pray** that God would give you and your loved ones the grace to seek Christ. **Praise God** for the official opening in Ireland of Galway Covenant Christian Fellowship’s new church building and for the Lord’s provision at every stage of the project, and **pray** for wisdom in how best to use these new premises for reaching out with the Gospel.

Tuesday: “Set your mind on things above, not on things on the earth.”—Colossians 3:2. **Pray** that you would be able to think heavenly thoughts. **Pray** for the First Reformed Presbyterian Church, Durham, North Carolina; for Pastor Kent Butterfield and his wife, Dr. Rosaria Butterfield, who faithfully teaches the Biblical view of sexuality; and for the outreach efforts of the congregation.

Friday: “Therefore put to death your members which are on the earth: fornication, uncleanness, passion, evil desire, and covetousness, which is idolatry.”—Colossians 3:5. **Pray** that you would be kept from all temptation. **Pray** for Hetherton (Mich.) Reformed Presbyterian Church, and Pastor Ray Morton, that they’d be encouraged in their ministry.

Saturday: “Because of these things the wrath of God is coming upon the sons of disobedience, in which you yourselves once walked when you lived in them.”—Colossians 3:6-7. **Pray** that many people would come to church tomorrow, and that they would repent of their rebellion against God.

Scripture Memory and Catechism Questions & Answers

“O how love I thy law! It is my meditation all the day.”—Psalm 119:97.

“For our God is a consuming fire.”—Hebrews 12:29.

“Except the Lord build the house, they labor in vain that build it. Except the Lord keep the city, the watchman waketh but in vain.”—Psalm 127:1.

Q. 32. What benefits do they that are effectually called partake of in this life?

A. They that are effectually called do in this life partake of justification, adoption, and sanctification, and the several benefits which in this life do either accompany or flow from them.

Q. 33. What is justification?

A. Justification is an act of God’s free grace, wherein he pardoneth all our sins, and accepteth us as righteous in his sight, only for the righteousness of Christ imputed to us, and received by faith alone.

Galatians 5:6 “The Faith of Justification”

Paul teaches that only by a living faith is a person justified.

I. Union with Christ

A. to be outside of Christ is to be lost

B. to be in Christ is to be saved

1. you must be united with Him
2. therefore, the question is, How can this be done?

II. What Does Not Work

A. circumcision

B. uncircumcision

III. What Does Matter

A. faith

1. faith is an empty hand reaching out to be filled
2. it’s the only means of salvation
3. it’s at the moment of faith that justification occurs

B. but, it’s a living faith

1. salvation is a package deal
2. saving faith therefore is always accompanied by all the other saving graces

Application—be sure that you’re really trusting in Christ by a genuine faith

A. not looking to anything other than Christ and His righteousness

B. but not a faith that is dead, but a living faith—that is, a **real** trusting in Christ
