

Devotional for Each Day of the Week

Sunday: “Who sharpen their tongue like a sword, And bend *their bows to shoot* their arrows—bitter words.”—Psalm 64:3.

Praise God because the shield of faith deflects all the enemy arrows!

Monday: “The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ *be* with your spirit. Amen.”—Philemon 25.

Pray that grace would be a primary character of your spirit for all who meet you. **Pray** that those who were converted to Christ in North Edinburgh, Scotland, would be encouraged and strengthened in the faith.

Tuesday: “God, who at various times and in various ways spoke in time past to the fathers by the prophets, has in these last days spoken to us by *His Son*, whom He has appointed heir of all things, through whom also He made the worlds.”—Hebrews 1:1-2.

Pray that you would not be a seeker of signs or miracles as proof of God, but one who trusts in the revealed word of Christ. **Pray** for the Frankston Reformed Presbyterian Church in Australia.

Wednesday: “. . . who being the brightness of *His* glory and the express image of His person, and upholding all things by the word of His power, when He had by Himself purged our sins, sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high.”—Hebrews 1:3.

Pray to understand what it means to say that Jesus Christ is the Mediatorial King, and to show others that understanding by your walk. **Pray** that our nation and its rulers would honor King Jesus.

Thursday: “. . . having become so much better than the angels, as He has by inheritance obtained a more excellent name than they.”—Hebrews 1:4.

Pray for those who call themselves Christian but do not believe Christ is God, that they would receive truth from on high. **Pray** for the Grace and Truth Reformed Presbyterian Church, Harrisonburg, Virginia.

Friday: “For to which of the angels did He ever say: *You are My Son, Today I have begotten You*’? And again: *I will be to Him a Father, And He shall be to Me a Son*’?”—Hebrews 1:5.

Pray for your pastor, as he seeks to expound the truth about Christ to a world that doesn’t want to hear it, and even to some in the church that may resist.

Pray that he would preach and teach with faithfulness and power.

Saturday: “But when He again brings the firstborn into the world, He says: *Let all the angels of God worship Him.*”—Hebrews 1:6.

Pray that in your church, Jesus Christ would be revealed for Who He really is, and worshipped and revered! **Pray** that many people would come to worship tomorrow, hear the message of salvation, and be converted.
