**Q. 12. What special act of providence did God exercise toward man in the estate wherein he was created?**

**A. When God had created man, he entered into a covenant of life with him, upon condition of perfect obedience; forbidding him to eat of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, upon the pain of death.**

**Q. 1** *What is the chief end of man?*

**A.** Man's chief end is to glorify God and to enjoy him forever.

**Q. 2** *What rule hath God given to direct us how we may glorify and enjoy him?*

**A.** The word of God, which is contained in the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments, is the only rule to direct us how to glorify and enjoy him.

**Q. 3** *What do the Scriptures principally teach?*

**A.** The Scriptures principally teach what man is to believe concerning God, and what duty God requires of man.

**Q. 4** *What is God?*

**A.** God is a Spirit, infinite, eternal, and unchangeable, in his being, wisdom, power, holiness, justice, goodness, and truth.

**Q. 5.** *Are there more Gods than one?*

**A.** There is but one only, the living and true God.

**Q. 6.** *How many persons are there in the Godhead?*

**A.** There are three persons in the Godhead, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost; and these three are one God, the same in substance, equal in power and glory.

**Q. 7.** *What are the decrees of God?*

**A.** The decrees of God are, his eternal purpose, according to the counsel of his will, whereby, for his own glory, he hath foreordained whatsoever comes to pass.

**Q. 8.** *How doth God execute his decrees?*

**A.** God executeth his decrees in the works of creation and providence.

**Q. 9.** *What is the work of creation?*

**A.** The work of creation is, God's making all things of nothing, by the word of his power, in the space of six days, and all very good.

**Q. 10.** *How did God create man?*

**A.** God created man male and female, after his own image, in knowledge, righteousness, and holiness, with dominion over the creatures.

**Q. 11.** *What are God's works of providence?*

**A:** God's works of providence are, his most holy, wise, and powerful preserving and governing all his creatures and all their actions.
