

Devotional for Each Day of the Week

Sunday: “He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn over all creation.”—Colossians 1:15. **Praise God** for His Son, Jesus, who is the firstborn over all things. **Pray** for Robert McCollum, as he preaches at the Frankston Reformed Presbyterian Church in Australia. **Pray** that Harriet Moton would soon be released from the hospital.

Monday: “For by Him all things were created that are in heaven and that are on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or principalities or powers.”—Colossians 1:16a. **Pray** that the rule of Jesus would be seen and acknowledged by our government. **Pray** for the Reformed Presbyterian ministry in Nantes, France.

Tuesday: “All things were created through Him and for Him.”—Colossians 1:16b. **Pray** that school teachers and scientists would understand that Jesus is the creator. **Pray** for the Enniskillen Fellowship of the Reformed Presbyterian Church of Ireland and the special public meetings tomorrow and Thursday which will celebrate the Reformation.

Wednesday: “And He is before all things, and by Him all things consist.”—Colossians 1:17. **Pray** that your friends and neighbors would believe in Jesus as the ruler of everything. **Pray** for our sister church in South Sudan; **pray** for the conversion of many men, women, and children; **pray** that the Cush4Christ team would be sustained.

Q. 18. Wherein consists the sinfulness of that estate whereinto man fell?

A. The sinfulness of that estate whereinto man fell, consists in the guilt of Adam’s first sin, the want of original righteousness, and the corruption of his whole nature, which is commonly called original sin; together with all actual transgressions which proceed from it.

Q. 19. What is the misery of that estate whereinto man fell?

A. All mankind by their fall lost communion with God, are under his wrath and curse, and so made liable to all the miseries of this life, to death itself, and to the pains of hell forever.

Introduction

I. The Fact of Free Will

A. the appeal to the people to make a choice

1. Joshua 24:15, 22; Judges 5:8; Isaiah 1:29; 66:4
2. men have free moral agency

B. this doctrine is also taught in the Creation itself

1. man is made after/in God’s image
2. Adam and Eve were told to exercise the moral responsibility they had

II. Man’s Four-Fold State

A. however, a problem has arisen—the problem of sin

B. state of innocency—“able to sin”

C. natural state—“not able not to sin”

D. state of grace—“able not to sin”

E. state of glory—“not able to sin”

Application

A. don’t think the will is divorced from the person himself

B. do not confuse liberty with ability

C. do not underestimate the free agency of the highest Moral Being—God Himself
