

Devotional for Each Day of the Week

Sunday: “They encourage themselves *in* an evil matter; They talk of laying snares secretly; They say, ‘Who will see them?’”—Psalm 64:5.

Praise God because you have His love, power, and faithfulness as your encouragement!

Monday: “But to which of the angels has He ever said: ‘*Sit at My right hand, Till I make Your enemies Your footstool*’?”—Hebrews 1:13.

Pray that your persecuted brethren worldwide would remember that God’s enemies are a footstool for Him, to their comfort.

Tuesday: “Are they not all ministering spirits sent forth to minister for those who will inherit salvation?”—Hebrews 1:14.

Pray for your witness to the unbelieving, knowing that among them are those who will inherit salvation. **Pray** for Dayton (Tenn.) Reformed Presbyterian Church, and that it would soon be able to have a pastor.

Wednesday: “Therefore we must give the more earnest heed to the things we have heard, lest we drift away.”—Hebrews 2:1.

Pray that your understanding of, and desire for, Scripture, would grow regularly, and your faith in His word as well, that you might not drift away from it. **Pray** for First Reformed Presbyterian Church, Durham, North Carolina, its pastor Kent Butterfield, and its outreach efforts. **Pray** also for Dr. Rosaria Butterfield, as she courageously speaks throughout the country on what the Bible says about sexuality, including homosexuality.

Thursday: “For if the word spoken through angels proved steadfast, and every transgression and disobedience received a just reward, how shall we escape if we neglect so great a salvation, which at the first began to be spoken by the Lord, and was confirmed to us by those who heard *Him*.”—Hebrews 2:2-3.

Pray for an understanding that the Word of God as written, the Scriptures, are truly enough to teach you to live a godly and faithful life. **Pray** for Elkhart (Ind.) Reformed Presbyterian Church, its new pastor Wade Mann, and the congregation’s outreach efforts.

Friday: “God also bearing witness both with signs and wonders, with various miracles, and gifts of the Holy Spirit, according to His own will?”—Hebrews 2:4.

Praise God that since He has already done the signs and wonders He planned to do, no more are necessary to verify His majesty.

Saturday: “For He has not put the world to come, of which we speak, in subjection to angels.”—Hebrews 2:5.

Pray for your pastor, that he would be encouraged in the faith, prepare a faithful message for tomorrow, and preach it with power and love.

Q. 4 What is God?

A. God is a Spirit, infinite, eternal, and unchangeable, in his being, wisdom, power, holiness, justice, goodness, and truth.

Q. 5. Are there more Gods than one?

A. There is but one only, the living and true God.

Q. 6. How many persons are there in the Godhead?
