

Devotional for Each Day of the Week

Sunday: “And by Him [Christ] to reconcile all things to Himself, by Him, whether things on earth or things in heaven, having made peace through the blood of His cross.”—Colossians 1:20. **Praise God** for Jesus, who brings peace and reconciliation. **Pray** for the Birmingham (Ala.) Reformed Presbyterian Fellowship, as it continues to mature and as it seeks to be recognized as a mission church.

Monday: “And you, who once were alienated and enemies in your mind by wicked works, yet now He has reconciled.”—Colossians 1:21. **Pray** that those you love would not be enemies of Christ. **Pray** for the 500th anniversary observance of the Protestant Reformation at Georgia Gwinnett College tomorrow. **Pray** for the Reformation observance in Cullybackey, Northern Ireland, and other places globally.

Tuesday: “To present you holy and blameless, and above reproach in His sight.”—Colossians 1:22b. **Pray** that we would be holy and blameless and above reproach. **Pray** for the Bloomington (Ind.) Reformed Presbyterian Church, pastored by Dr. Rich Holdeman and Adam Niess; **pray** for its ministry to students at Indiana University.

Wednesday: “If indeed you continue in the faith, grounded and steadfast, and are not moved away from the hope of the gospel.”—Colossians 1:23a. **Pray** that you and your friends would have steadfast gospel faith.

Thursday: “. . . the riches of the glory of this mystery among the Gentiles: which is Christ in you, the hope of glory.”—Colossians 1:27. **Pray** that we would treasure Jesus, finding in Him our glorious hope. **Pray** for the Columbus (Ind.) Reformed Presbyterian Church, pastored by Andy McCracken; **pray** that the congregation would continue to grow in grace, and that their ministry plans would bear fruit.

Friday: “Him we preach, warning every man and teaching every man in all wisdom.”—Colossians 1:28ab. **Pray** that we would boldly preach and teach Jesus, and warn everyone of the need to repent and believe the gospel. **Pray** for the Dayton (Tenn.) Reformed Presbyterian Church, for its growth spiritually and numerically.

Saturday: “That we may present every man perfect in Christ Jesus.”—Colossians 1:28c. **Pray** that many people would come to church tomorrow, that they would hear of the salvation that is in Christ Jesus, and that they would respond to that message in faith.

Scripture Memory and Catechism Questions & Answers

“If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.”—I John 1:9.

“Continue earnestly in prayer, being vigilant in it with thanksgiving.”—Colossians 4:2.

Q. 21. Who is the Redeemer of God’s elect?

A. The only Redeemer of God’s elect is the Lord Jesus Christ, who, being the eternal Son of God, became man, and so was, and continueth to be, God and man in two distinct natures, and one person, forever.

Q. 33. What is justification?

A. Justification is an act of God’s free grace, wherein he pardoneth all our sins, and accepteth us as righteous in his sight, only for the righteousness of Christ imputed to us, and received by faith alone.
